

Welcome to the 2021 YK CEDS Virtual Work Session! The Opening Plenary will kick off this year's virtual gathering with a prayer and land acknowledgement, an overview of the three-day session schedule, and a current update of the YK Region Story, where we are and where we want to be.

This year's Keynote speakers are three members of the Yukon Delta National Wildlife Refuge (NWR)'s 2021 all-local Yup'ik waterfowl technician crew. Paul Larson (from Napaskiak) is studying wildlife biology and conservation at UAF, with ambitions to get a Masters degree studying wildlife. This was Paul's first summer at the Yukon Delta National Wildlife Refuge (NWR). He worked for the Kodiak NWR in 2019. Paul was a shining star in 2021, uplifting everyone's spirits and exceeding all expectations of field work and knowledge. Jaden Anaver (from Kipnuk) is attending UAF, where he is studying to be a math teacher. Jaden enjoys biology and working with the wildlife during the summers. He is an accomplished technician with phenomenal skills and attention to detail. This was Jaden's second year on the waterfowl crew. Randall Friendly (from Tuntutuliak) was hired into a Pathways position, which guarantees him a permanent biologist position at the Refuge upon completion of his Masters degree. Randall has worked for Yukon Delta NWR as a technician or field crew leader for five seasons. In 2021, he led a crew hired by the Alaska Department of Fish and Game to collect the data for his Masters degree projects studying spectacled eider nest success on Kigigak Island and in Utqiagvik.



Hiring local technicians is a priority of the waterfowl program. Students are primarily hired via the Alaska Native Science and Engineering Program (ANSEP). The Refuge encourages those interested to join ANSEP or let the Refuge know you are interested in working on the field crews.
